- P.1 Born 1933 in Kendal.  
Grayrigg Bank, Appleby Road.  
Father policeman (John Owen, PC10), very strict with his children and others.
- P.2 Fellow policemen.  
Visiting Father at Lowther St. police station. Seeing the cells.  
Mr O'Neill, Chief Constable.  
Going mushrooming to Watercrock.  
Sunday morning walks. Days off spent at Sandside.
- P.3 Learning to swim in Kent at Low Mills.  
Moved to new house at Rinkfield about 1933; then moved to Lound Gardens.  
Attended Dean Gibson School, then Senior Girls, Windermere Rd.  
Nuns taught at Dean Gibson.
- P.4 Teachers at Senior Girls'.  
Began work at K Shoes, punching patterns on shoes.
- P.5 Dances at the Town Hall, Saturday nights.  
Joined Land Army at 16. First Land Girl in Arnside (Arnside Tower).  
Uniform.  
Delivery by milk float.
- P.6 First day on the farm.  
Gang of Land Girls working nearby (Milnthorpe).  
Lived as part of the family; paid ten shillings a week for first six weeks.
- P.7 Whilst in Land Army moved to Windermere and then New Hutton.  
Married a farmer in 1943.  
Stock kept on the farm. Extra help at haytime and threshing time.  
Threshing machines used to go round farms.
- P.8 Borrowing from neighbours.  
Generator for electricity.  
Did washing by hand. Boiler in kitchen. Domestic routine.
- P.9 Dolly blue from Backbarrow.  
Keeping bees; malasses for cows (and gingerbread).  
Salting and storing bacon.
- P9/10 Killing pigs. Making black puddings.
- P.10 Making brawn.  
Joined WI and Mothers' Union.
- P.11 Walking two miles to WI meeting on curing rabbit skins to make gloves.
