- 3 Looking after the gas lamps.  
Raising fruit and vegetables for sale. Local shops.
- 4 Railings on Kendal/ Green.
- 5 Housewifery classes on Milnthorpe Road. Abbot Hall sports day. Day visits to Morecambe.
- 6 Days out at Sandside. Hopscotch, marbles, harkaway, cricket.  
Coronation mugs.
- 7 Whitsuntide Sunday School treat by canal barge.  
Pioneers from YWCA gave gym display in London.
- 8 Joined sewing group in Prince Charlie's house.  
Tennis; quiet room; dancing.
- 9 Local singers. Dances at YWCA and in Town Hail. .
- 10 Dances at Parish Hall and Abbot Hall. Began work at K Shoes at 14.
- 11 Labeliing shoe boxes. Attending technical college to learn about making shoes.  
K Fete.
- 12 Aireys Dance Academy. Sargens School of Dancing
- 13 During war worked at Napiers aircraft factory in Liverpool making small tools.  
Dancing in New Brighton; living in digs.
- 14 Back to K Shoes after the war.  
Kendale club. Livingstone's shoe warehouse.  
Celebrations at the end of the war.
- 15 Utility furniture; wedding receptions held in caes.  
Lived in house on Stoney Lane.
- 16 Alterations to houses on Feilside. Fellside and its "characters".
- 17 Wildman Street rope shop - Moore's. Husband bought Mealbank Mill for concrete works.
- 18 Built warehouse at Mealbank for K Shoes.  
Husband bought Summerlands and then invested in Goodacres (2003).
